

HiTouch Business Service LLC has been converted to a limited liability company. While the type of legal entity has changed, the entity itself is the same - there was no assignment of your contract, nor was there any acquisition of the contracting entity by a successor entity.

For federal tax purposes, HiTouch Business Services LLC is disregarded as an entity separate from its sole owner, Staples Inc. This requires us to name Staples, Inc. as the taxpayer on line 1 of Form W-9, and HiTouch Business Services LLC as the "disregarded entity" on Line 2. Form W-9 then requires the EIN listed to be the EIN for the entity listed on Line 1, which in this case is Staples, Inc.

As a result, the EIN of HiTouch Business Services LLC will not appear on the attached Form W-9. For your records, the EIN of HiTouch Business Services LLC is 27-2313934. This will be the EIN that appears on your invoice. Payments should continue to be made to HiTouch Business Services LLC. We have attached a copy of an IRS 147C Letter which verifies HiTouch Business Service LLC's EIN.

## **Purpose of Form**

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

· Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

 Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)

- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)

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- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- · Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding, later.
